## APPLICATION QUESTIONS

James 1:22 says, *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”* These questions are designed to help you apply today’s message to your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others. 1. Read John 4:7-9. What do you think about the fact that Jesus spoke first to this woman? What are some ways you could speak first to get into a witnessing conversation?

2. Take a look at Acts 7:2; Gen. 28:10, 13; Ex. 3:1-2; Lk. 19:5; Acts 9:3-5. How do all these passages show how God spoke first and took initiative in a person’s life?

3. Read John 4:10-12. What do you think about the way Jesus took the offensive? What was the woman’s response? What does this show us about her?

4. Read John 4:13-15. What are some of the characteristics of this living water? How does Jer. 2:13; 17:13; Ps. 36:9 and Gal. 2:20 help us better understand what is going on here?

5. Read John 4:16-17a. What is the Lord doing here? Why? What are some of Christ’s arrows that He shoots at your heart? How do you respond?

6. Read John 4:17b-19. What does Jesus reveal about Himself here? How does this text help us understand how the gospel connects with sexuality? Discuss the difference between revealing sin to shame someone and to actually help someone.

7. Read the take home questions. Which one challenges you or encourages you the most? What are some new thoughts about witnessing that you want to grow in as a result of this passage?
