## FALL MORNING BIBLE CLASS 2021 JOHN 14:7-11

John 14:7-11: Jesus said, (7) Jesus said (to Thomas), "If you had known Me, you would have known My Father also. From now on you do know Him and have <u>seen</u> Him." (8) Philip said to Him, "Lord, show us the Father, and that is sufficient for us." (9) Jesus said to Philip, "Have I been with you such a long time, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has <u>seen</u> Me has seen the Father. So how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? (10) Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in Me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on My own authority. But the Father who lives in Me does the works. (11) Believe Me that I am in the Father, and the Father is in Me. Or else believe Me on account of the works themselves."

## A RIGHT KIND OF SEEING:

- 1. Interesting here, "...do know (Gk word 'ginosko') Him and have seen (Gk word 'horao' means 'to see with understanding') Him". (John 14:7)
  - John 20:4-6: "...so they (Peter and John) ran both together: and the other disciple (John) did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre (tomb). And he (John) stooping down, and look in, saw (Gk word 'blepo' means 'to see with the mind's eye to turn the thoughts or direct the mind to a thing, to consider, contemplate, look at, to weigh carefully, examine' 'that the image of the graveclothes within the tomb had impressed itself upon the retain of John's eyes') the linen clothes lying; yet he went not in. Then Simon Peter comes following him (John), and went into the sepulchre, and sees (Gk word 'theoreo' means 'puzzle over' or 'scrutinize') the linen clothes lie..."
    - Peter pushed John aside and actually entered the tomb. Here he had opportunity to observe the graveclothes. In this case, Peter needed to puzzle over the fact that the clothes were there but the body was gone. If the body had been taken away, why were the graveclothes not taken away with it?
    - ✓ John tells us that he "saw and believed".
    - ∠ True, there is a 'seeing' that is altogether right. In this 'seeing', the sequence (a connected series) is obviously:

•	1) seeing the Lo	rd Jesus Christ with
•	2) coming to	Jesus as the result of that seeing,

3) and coming to know God through \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Jesus.
