# **Further Reflection for 11/13**

## **Reflection:**

- 1. What is an illustration that you or someone else has used that has been very helpful for you in understanding something difficult?
- 2. What in your life is the most life-giving thing that you do?

### Study:

- 1. Read Revelation 16-20 (at a minimum read 16:18-21; 17:1-6; 18:1-5, 11-16; 19:1-8)
  - a. What jumps out to you from the text?
  - b. Are there any images/illustrations that John writes that reminded you of other biblical texts? If so, which ones?
  - c. 16:18-21 shares the picture of the destruction of Rome, most scholars believe it is talking about the collapse of the social/ political structures of Rome rather than the literal destruction of the place. What is an area of life where you have seen how something/someone continues down a path that ended in destruction?
  - d. 17:1-6 shares about the "great prostitute" that is the goddess of Roma, and how some of the things that culturally are thought to bring life, actually bring death. What are the temptations in your life that if left unchecked will mar the image of God in which you are created?
  - e. 18:1-5, 11-16 point to the things that "empires" invite us to consume and how they will lead us to justify "luxury goods" at the expense of others. What is a way that you can guard against that reality?
  - f. 19:1-8 begins the celebration of the "marriage" between the lamb of God (Jesus) and his bride (The Church). This text is a reminder to not worry about the world around us, nor to put our hope in the things of this world. Why is that so easy to say and not nearly as easy to do?
