Meg graduated from the University of Iowa with a bachelors degree

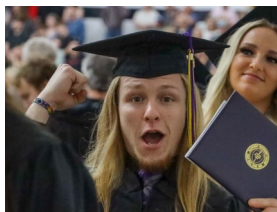
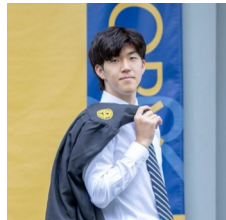


Rumen Hulmequist
