Some Myths of Eschatology

- Eschatology is <u>unimportant</u>.
- Eschatology is not a <u>clear</u> doctrine.
- It makes no difference which eschatological view I take.

The Importance of Eschatology

- Eschatology reminds us that God is <u>sovereign</u>.
- Eschatology reminds us that God is good.
- Eschatology motivates us to <u>live</u> holy.
- Eschatology gives us <u>hope</u>.
- Eschatology directs us to worship God.

Studying Eschatology (Hermeneutics)

Our method of interpretation must be...

<u>Literal</u> – <u>Grammatical</u> – <u>Historical</u>
