1. Read John 17:1-5. Who is Jesus praying for in these verses? What do you think about praying for yourself? What does that look like in your life?

2. Read John 17:5, 11, 21, 24, 25; Matt. 14:19; Jn. 11:41; Eph. 3:14. What is the significance of Jesus using the word “Father” when He prays? What is the significance of you using the word “Father” when you pray?

3. Read Matthew 6:9-13. What are some similarities and differences between the Disciples’ Prayer and the Lords’ prayer. Which one is which? Why do you think that?

4. Read Jn. 2:4; 7:6, 8; 8:20. Why hadn’t Jesus’ time come yet in these verses? What do you do when you are waiting for significant times to come in your life? (Eph. 5:15-16)

5. Read Rom. 11:36; Isa. 42:8; 48:11. What do these verses teach us about the glory of God? Read Psa. 2:7; 72:17; 110:1. How does the Father glorify the Son in these verses?

6. Read Jn. 12:23-28; Lk. 24:26. How does the Son glorify the Father in these passages? How can you glorify God in a similar way?

7. Read the take home questions. Which one challenges you or encourages you the most? Why? How will you live differently from what you learned from this passage?
