Hebrew 2:14-15

HEBREWS 2:14 KJV: "Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, He also Himself likewise took part of the same; that through death He might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil;"

HEBREWS 2:14 BAR: "The children share in a flesh and blood human nature, and He too in exactly the same way shared in the same things. The purpose of His doing so was to destroy him who had death in his control, I mean, the devil."

HEBREWS 2:14 SEB: "The 'children' are human. So, Jesus also shared in their humanity. He wanted to use death to destroy the devil who has the power of death."
