Questions for Sunday, March 8

Personal Reflection:

1. Have you ever been a part of something that was better/worse than you expected spiritually?

Personal Study:

- 1. Read Romans 4:1-5, 13-17
 - a. Abraham began with faith that God was who he said he was. That faith moved him to action.
 - i. Can you imagine leaving all you know on faith?
 - ii. How should the life of Jesus: impact our faith? Our action?
- 2. Read Genesis 12:1-3, 15:6
 - a. Why is it important to know ALL people were to be blessed through God
 - b. What might happen if we remembered that God came for all people?

Personal Application:

- 1. What might be the part of your life that causes you to have the least amount of faith?
- 2. Is there an area of your life that you know you have not trusted God with that area?
- 3. Is there a part of you that tries to "earn" God's love?

Personal Prayer:

Father, thank you for the way you call all people to be your people! Help me to see all people as people that need to receive your love and to recognize I am the person you are calling to give that love. Help me to respond in love in all situations, especially when it is hard. Thank you for your grace and may I give grace. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

Group Conversation

Group Reflection:

- 1. Have you ever been a part of something that was better/worse than you expected? If so explain.
- 2. Thinking about Abraham, what does it mean to be a blessing to others?
- 3. How can we make sure we live as people who are "Christians who happen to live in America" versus "Americans who happen to be Christians"?

Group Study:

- 1. Read Romans 4:1-5, 13-17
 - a. What do you think it means to respond in loving obedience, rather than obligation?

- b. What can make it difficult to have faith? Why?
- c. Can we have faith without action?
- 2. Read Genesis 12:1-3, 15:6
 - a. Can you imagine leaving all you know in faith because you believe God is calling you? Have you ever done that?
 - b. Thinking about 15:6, why might we be able to live radically different if we believed that God saw our faith as righteous? In other words, why might we be able to live different culturally because we know we are in right relationship with God and others?

Group Application:

- 1. How can we bless one another?
- 2. How can we, as a group, be a blessing to others?
