James 1:22 says, *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”* These questions are designed to help you apply today’s message to your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others. 1. Read John 11:1-3. How close is Jesus with Lazarus, Mary, and Martha? What do we learn from Mary and Martha in Luke 10:38-42? What do we learn about Mary in John 12:1-3? What is the most clear way that Jesus shows His love for you? (Rom. 5:8; Jn. 15:13)

2. Read John 11:4. What did Jesus mean when He said, “This illness does not lead to death”? How was this illness used for the glory of God? (Jn. 9:1-3; Jn. 2:11; Jms. 1:2-4)

3. Read John 11:5-7. Why did Jesus stay two days longer in the place where He was? What does Isaiah 55:8-9 teach us about God’s wisdom?

4. Read John 11:8-10. Why didn’t the disciples want to go back to Judea? What was Jesus’ answer? How does that apply to our lives today?

5. Read John 11:11-13. How did Jesus speak of death? How does the Bible speak of death? Why do you think the Bible speaks of death in this way? How can that help us when we think of death?

6. Read John 11:14-15. What was the mysterious thing that Jesus says in verse 15? At a surface reading why does this seem so odd? Why was Jesus glad that He was not there?

7. Read John 11:16. Who was Thomas? How was he characterized? (Jn. 20:25) What good thing did Thomas do or show in John 11:16? How was this courageous?

8. Read the take home points. Which one encourages you or challenges you the most? Why? How will you live your life differently this week based on what you have learned in this passage?
