Discussion Topic #1: Persecution

Discussion Topic #2:

Preparing for Proclamation in the Midst of Persecution

In **Acts 8:4**, those that were scattered (not the apostles) went about preaching the word. How could we do a better job of preparing ourselves and the next generation for the proclamation of the gospel even if we suffer for it?

How does **1 Peter 3:13-18** motivate us and show us the good news?

Discussion Topic #3: Joy in Whatever Situation

What responses other than joy would you have expected in Samaria due to their current situation (**Acts 8:5-8**)?

Joy comes not when the situation is ideal but when we are doing what God wants us to do in the places He puts us. Do you think that's true? How might that change how we pray?

Life seemed more normal for most of us, then. That's when we started a series through the first 7 chapters of Acts. In May we finished chapter 7 and today we pick it up in chapter 8.

Acts is the true story of how Jesus' work continues through Holy Spirit-empowered believers who proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.
