Ephesians 6:12-13



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#### Intro:

Scripture is clear, there are only two kingdoms that we can belong to, Satan's kingdom of darkness, or God's kingdom of light. Belonging to one automatically puts us in opposition to the other.

As said before, the church is not a cruise ship or a showboat with the Pastor as the master of ceremonies! It is a battleship.

Hence, we are in a spiritual war with no chance of neutrality. We have to engage in this battle if we hope to walk in a victorious life of peace, hope and joy.

#### Intro:

Christians who are not engaged in this battle and walk around as if there is no battle become a casualty of war. They are defeated at every point of temptation and virtually useless to the Kingdom of God.

This spiritual war is a continuous, personal conflict with the evil spiritual forces of darkness. But we can be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His immeasurable might!

#### I. The Nature of our Enemy

Our battle is not against people but is a spiritual battle against evil, demonic forces which are:

- 1. Numerous; a third of the angels fell with Satan. They are rulers, authorities, principalities in the heavens.
- 2. Powerful; Though their power is limited by God they are still given authority over the earth and its inhabitants. They can even oppose other angelic beings. Dan 10:5-13

#### I. The Nature of our Enemy

- 3. Wicked; The exist to do the bidding of their leader, Satan. As such they are completely opposed to all that is good, holy and righteous.
- 4. Cleaver; They are morally corrupt but possess enormous intelligence. They disguise themselves as angels of light and servants of righteousness.
- 5. Real; They are not just an impersonal, evil influence. They want to destroy our purity, health and wholeness.

#### II. The Nature of our Battle

- A. It's a Spiritual Battle: The Greek word for "wrestle" indicates it is a mortal battle. It is not a battle between flesh and blood, not a battle between human beings but a struggle within human beings.
- B. A Battle between truth and lies: we battle inward between Satan's deceptive enticements to sin and God's righteous word of truth and life. Sin is always portrayed as attractive and filling. But Satan never reminds us of the consequences of those enticements.

#### II. The Nature of our Battle

C. It's a Continuous Battle: It is clearly depicted as not being a one time or infrequent event, but one that occurs daily. Satan does not slacken up on his attacks against the Christian warrior. There is never any truce or temporary halt in the conflict.

#### III. The Nature of our Preparation

A. It is God's armor: We are never asked or expected to go to battle in the flesh. In fact we are warned not to, 2 Cor. 10:3-5, Zec. 4:6. Although it is God's armor we are expected to actively take it and put it on.

#### III. The Nature of our Preparation

- B. We must put on the Full armor of God: We need the divine equipment in its completeness, without the lack of any single part. We must not let any weakness be exposed to Satan's attacks.
- 1. Adequate and timely preparation is essential for victory: Waiting until calamity hits is not the time to start preparing for the battle. Prov. 24:10.
- 2. Evil days will surely come: It's not that the days will continually become more and more evil. They will. Here Paul is referring to those times when we come under severe attack and must be especially prepared to face them in the strength and might of God.

**Believers face three enemies** -- the (controlled by Satan -(fallen in Adam, influenced by Satan and the world he controls) and the deal. In Ephesians 6:10-18, Paul's focus is upon the spiritual adversary, but one needs to remember that these three "divisions" are somewhat arbitrary, because the effects of the **world** and the **flesh** cannot always be separated from the devil and his minions who work through these other "enemies". One word of encouragement - you are in a spiritual war and just as occurs in real warfare, you will experience some victories and some defeats in individual battles. That is part of growing in grace and the knowledge of Christ Jesus ( ), maturing in your Christian walk, progressively being set aside more and more (being sanctified, being conformed gradually more and more into the image of God's Son - cp ). But as long as we are in these mortal bodies, we are not yet perfect and sin will still bring passing pleasure (emphasize 

in a moment of weakness (or perhaps a moment of selfsufficiency, self-assurance, or self-confidence rather than in reliance on Christ, cp \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_). And so unfortunately we will lose some of the battles. That is a reality, whether your name is Billy Graham or Charles Haddon Spurgeon. But when you lose a particular battle and you lie on the ground, bloody and bruised (spiritually speaking), don't let the enemy (the accuser and slanderer, cp (10 loser) tell you that you are a "loser" and you will never have victory (cp \_\_\_\_\_ where "gives" is present tense = God continually gives us the victory in Christ!).
