Three Keys of A Biblical Worldview

A biblical worldview is one that is shaped by the Bible and centered on the person and work of Jesus Christ.

It has three keys:

Truth: God’s Opinion, Not Mine

Submission: God’s Terms, Not Mine

Relationship: God’s Pattern, Not Mine
(Love God, Love One Another)

1. Truth: God’s Opinion, Not Mine

Everyone has an opinion, even God. A biblical worldview elevates God’s opinion above all others, seeing it as the very definition of truth. The Bible guides us, not our culture.

2 Peter 1:20-21... *Above all, you must realize that no prophecy in Scripture ever came from the prophet’s own understanding, or from human initiative. No, those prophets were moved by the Holy Spirit, and they spoke from God.*

2. Submission: God’s Terms, Not Mine

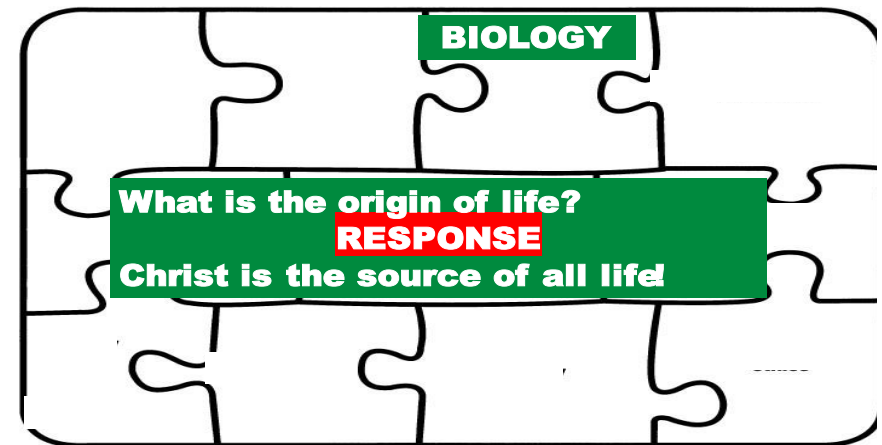
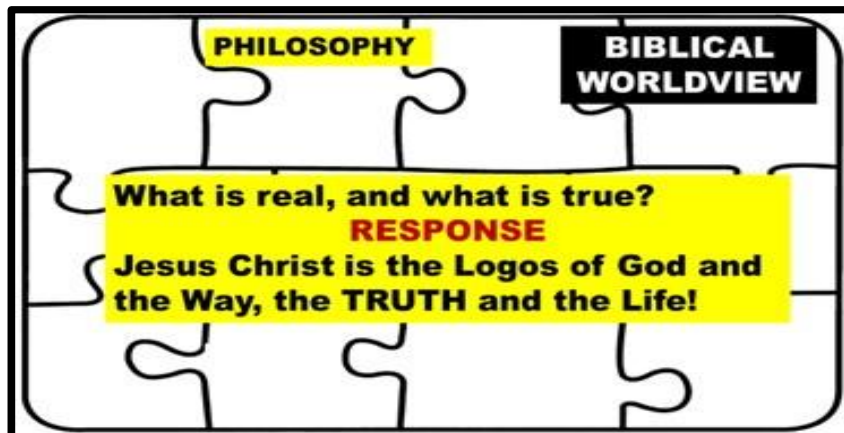
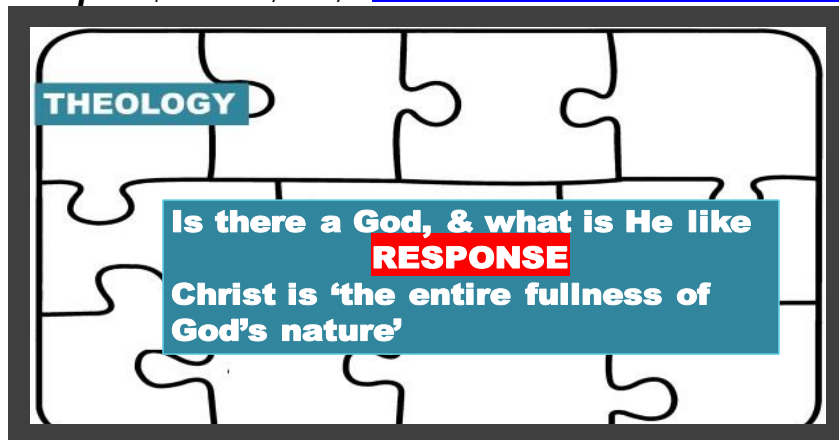
Knowing the truth is one thing; submitting to it is another. Christians with a biblical worldview allow the Bible to be authoritative in their everyday lives. They come to God on his terms, not their own.

2 Timothy 3:16... *All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right.*

3. Relationship: God's Pattern, Not Mine

Love God, Love People. A biblical worldview is not simply academic or philosophical. The story of the Bible – as with the Christian life itself – is about a relationship with God and with people. Christians with a biblical worldview are pursuers of God, not just students of the Bible.

Matthew 22:37-39... *Jesus replied, “You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. 1. Jesus Christ is the Creator of Life.

2. Jesus Christ is the Author of Life.

“You killed the Author of life, but God raised Him from the dead...” (Acts 3:15, NIV)

3. Jesus Christ is the Word of Life.

“That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched – this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.” (1 John 1:1, NIV)

4. Jesus Christ is the Bread of Life.

“Then Jesus declared, ‘I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry...” (John 6:35, NIV)

5. Jesus Christ is Abundant Life.

“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life and have it to the full.” (John 10:10, NIV; “more abundantly,” (NKJ)
