Further Reflection for 4/18

1. Read 1 John 3:1-7, 10
2. Why do you think it is easier to feel like we have found our self in what we know rather than trying to become all that God has for us?
3. How might your life be better if your primary identity was found in being known as a child of God? How might that help reorient the rest of your life?
4. John makes it clear that we are to look like Jesus. Often, we find that difficult because we feel like we are “only human.” What might happen if we sought after Jesus and trusted he really could transform us? What are ways that Jesus may look different than we may think?
5. How do we live in such a way that our life reflects the fact that Jesus died to take away our sins?
6. Summarize verse 6 and share how we might apply that verse in practical ways in our lives. How would you share your summary with someone else?
7. How do we understand righteousness by looking at verse 7? In order to not be led astray, what do we use for “filters” of information.
8. Read verse 10 and list the key points of the verse. Often sins are things we don’t do. Verse 10 adds something that we are called to do. What is that and why is it difficult?
9. Pray this week, “Father, help me to be holy as you are holy. May I know your love and share your love. Help me to find my true identity as your child. In Jesus’ name I pray, Amen.”
