### **CALL TO WORSHIP – From Psalm 113:1-3**

“Praise the LORD! Praise, O servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD! Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time forth and forevermore! From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised!”

### **PRAYER OF ADORATION & PRAISE**

### **PRAYER OF CONFESSION (Unison)**

We can easily forget that you are still good when circumstances are so bad. Remind us that no suffering can threaten our eternal salvation. Forgive us our sins in Jesus Christ, who endured unthinkable suffering because he trusted you would use his suffering for great good. Thank you for our suffering Savior, who was condemned so that we can be forgiven. Fill us with the Holy Spirit to trust in you no matter what suffering we face in this life. Amen.

### **ASSURANCE OF PARDON – Romans 8:1**

“There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.”

### **AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (Responsive) – Westminster Shorter Catechism (Question 38)**

Leader: What benefits do believers receive from Christ at the resurrection?
