Further Reflection for 12/19

Reflection:

- 1. What is a moment in which you felt peace in a way you never had before?
- 2. What are the things in life that bring you the least/most peace?

Study:

- 1. Read Hebrews 10:5-10
 - a. What are the things that jump out to you from the text?
 - b. What is the point trying to be shared in verse 5?
 - c. Verses 6-8 are intertwined in their meaning. What is the writer trying to get the reader to understand in these verses?
 - d. Vere 9 shares that the first covenant was set aside for the second covenant. What is the first covenant and what is the second covenant?
 - e. Verses 9 and 10 combine to tell us that Jesus came to do the will of God and in doing so made it possible to be made holy (other translations will say "to sanctify"). What does what Jesus did mean for how you are called to live?

Application:

- 1. What is one way you could be more obedient to God?
- 2. How might you daily practice allowing God to sanctify (make holy) you? How might that add to your sense of peace?

Prayer:

Father, help me to be made holy. May I live in obedience to you and reflect the love of your Son in all I do and say. In Jesus' name I Pray. Amen.

Spiritual Practice:

 Meditate on the words of Jesus found in the sermon on the mount (Matthew 5-7) and think aloud whether you embody the things you have read.
