

Further Reflection - 1 Peter 5

- 1. Read 1 Peter 5
- 2. Peter begins this chapter by talking about the "elders".
- a. Why is it important to note that elder is a role in the church and not necessarily marked by an age?
- 3. What does it mean to shepherd someone else? How might that be something we are all to do?
- 4. Why is it important for all of us to follow someone else (to be shepherded by)?
- 5. Define humility
- 6. Peter is explicit that we are to cast our cares upon God in verse 7 and then in verse 8 he calls us to be mindful of the world around us and engaged with it. How do we reconcile both of these ideas?
- 7. Peter uses the word 'devil' it describes less a singular person and more the powers of evil. How do we make sure we 'stand firm' when we are tempted, surrounded by evil, or just plain worn out?
- 8. Finally, think about how you can "clothe yourself with humility?" How might these practices help us to be more and more aware of God's work in our lives and our need for God's work in our lives?
