When we're committed to our own satisfaction, God's work doesn't flourish.

We can renew our commitment to the work of God by;

- 1. understanding how it relates to Haggai's message. v1, 1 Peter 5:1-4, Galatians 4:5
- 2. by refusing to offer excuses. v2, Matthew 25:14–30, Micah 6:8, Romans 1:20
- **3. by setting our priorities.** v3-6, Luke 10:41-42, John 15:4–7
 - a. God's work must come before our work. v3-4 Jeremiah 29:5-7.
 - b. God's ways must come before our ways. v5-6, Ephesians 5:15–16
- 4. by getting Involved in our Lord's work. v1:7–11, Colossians 3:23–24
 - a. The purposes of obedience. v7-8, 1 John 2:3-6, Psalm 128:1
 - **b. The cost of disobedience.** v9-11, Matthew 5:21-30

Ephesians 2:8-10 For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.
