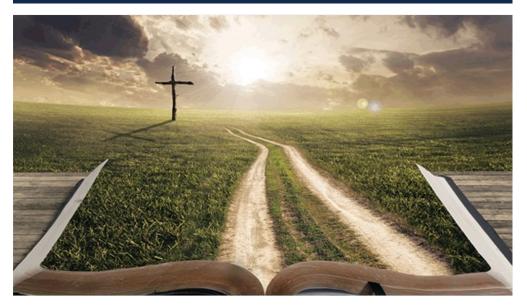

# **Further Study**

#### Personal Reflection:

- 1. Have you ever had a moment when someone stood up for you? How did that make you feel?
- 2. What has been your greatest moment of suffering?

#### Personal Study:

- 1. Read Romans 5:1-11
  - a. Paul is saying that when we are right with God we receive peace, grace, and hope. Describe when/if you have received peace, grace, and hope from God?
  - b. What does it look like to understand suffering as something to glory in?
- c. How might suffering lead to perseverance, perseverance lead to character, and character lead to hope?
  - d. Describe the meaning of verse 8 in your own words.
- 2. Read Romans 2 Corinthians 5:17-21
  - a. In light of this passage and Paul's writings, how do we understand reconciliation?

#### **Personal Application:**

- 1. What would it look like if you were able to see suffering from this perspective?
- 2. What is the greatest act of perseverance in your life?

#### **Personal Prayer:**

Father, thank you for your desire for us to be reconciled to you. Please help me to see suffering as an opportunity to learn perseverance and for that to shape my character to be like Jesus. Please help me to continually accept the salvation you offer. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.

#### **Group Reflection:**

- 1. Have you ever had a moment when someone stood up for you? How did that make you feel?
- 2. What has been your greatest moment of suffering? Perseverance?
- 3. What would our connect group look helped one another persevere?

#### **Group Study:**

- 1. Read Romans 5:1-11
  - a. Would you share a time when you sensed God's peace in a situation that from the outside it would make no sense to have peace?
  - b. What does it look like to understand suffering as something to glory in?
  - c. The Greek word translated to suffering is the same words used to describe metal refined by fire. How does that help us understand what Paul is writing?
  - d. How might suffering lead to perseverance, perseverance lead to character, and character lead to hope?
  - e. How does verse 8 make you think about Jesus? Why?
- 2. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21
  - a. How might this further help our understanding of what Paul is writing in Ro mans about reconciliation?
  - b. What might happen if we lived as a people trying to be reconciled with one another and with God?

#### **Group Application:**

- 1. How do we help one another through suffering?
- 2. How can we help model reconciliation?
