Knowing the Word

Before we jump into applying the Word to our lives, we need to make sure we have a right interpretation of the Word through Holy Spirit-empowered observation and interpretation. Pause to pray and ask God to help us as we look at His Word together.

Look back at **Nehemiah 9** and point out to each other all the times we see God's people being rebellious or disobedient.

What are they committed to doing now as we turn to chapter 10? (see **Nehemiah 9:38** and **Nehemiah 10:28-29** for the answer)

Based on Biblical history and your own personal experience, do you think they're going to be successful at keeping the covenant and obeying all of God's commandments?

Applying the Word

What are some ways that parents encourage kids to be obedient?

We know that we will not be justified before God through obedience to His law (**Galatians 2:16**).

So what motivates us to obey God as Christians?

After discussing this for a bit, you may want to look to Scripture to see what you missed! What motivation for obedience is found in these?

Ephesians 4:32	2 Peter 3:11-12	Hebrews 10:26-27

In Nehemiah 10:28-39, they lay out 3 areas of obedience affected by their covenant relationship with God: Marriage, Time, Money/Materials.

- How did or how will your relationship with God affect who you choose to marry/not marry?
- How does your relationship with God affect how you use time?
- How does your relationship with God affect how you use money and material things?

COMING BACK AND BUILDING UP

Kids quite naturally disobey their parents.
Likewise, disobeying God comes quite naturally to all of us.

What motivates us to obey?

In Nehemiah 10, we will see that
God's covenant faithfulness to His people
throughout the generations
(which included lots of grace and some discipline)
has led them to respond by making a
covenant together to obey Him.
