The brightest star in our night sky is Vega. It has the brightness magnitude of 0. The dimmest star that the average human eye can see unaided has a brightness magnitude of 6. After doing lots of calculating and figuring, they came to the conclusion that the candles flame can be seen about 1.6 miles away at night.
