Further Reflection for 5/9

- 1. Read 1 John 5:1-6
- 2. Think of a time in your life when you had a fresh start with something or someone? How did it feel?
- 3. Share a time when you were not able to have a fresh start and you really wish you could have had one?
- 4. John writes about being born of God. In other words, when we follow Jesus we can have a new life. How has that idea been meaningful in your life?
- 5. In verse 2 John writes about loving others and that it happens in a particular way. What way is that? Why is that way so difficult?
- 6. How might we understand love for God based on John's writing?
- 7. The world is not meant to be understood as persons, but more systems, structures, and ways of life. Describe some things that you think of as "the world."
- 8. Verse 6 talks about Jesus coming from "water and blood."
 Most scholars believe John is talking about Jesus' baptism by water and the crucifixion that led to the shedding of his blood.
 Describe the impact of Jesus' baptism on you? Share your baptism story. Describe the impact of Jesus' crucifixion?
 Share the impact of communion in your life?
- 9. Pray this week, "Father, help me to be overcome the world through your love. May I share your love by obedience to your law of love. Help me to find my true identity as your child. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen."
