

CHAPTER ONE:

3 SIGNIFICANT USES OF WORDS

Words have three significant uses.

Your ability to use them well for these **three purposes** will bring a revolution in your life.

The three significant uses of words are:

1. **Creating**

2. **Naming**

3. **Communication**

Each of these three uses when mastered with the right biblical principles can cause a very powerful effect in the life of the believer.

They will be the difference between stagnation and breakthrough, increase and decrease, prosperity and poverty, health and sickness and life and death

in the life of the believer.

Let us look at them individually.

Creating

Words are what God used to create the world.

In the very beginning, He spoke words to create everything we see around.

Heb 11:3 Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear.

Hebrews 11:3

The word of God framed the world. It is the creative force that brought the world into being.

Without it, there would be no world.

There would be no animals, there will be no trees.

Words have creative power.

The next time you want to say something, know that your words can create.

I will never forget the dream a friend narrated to me.

In that dream everything he spoke begun to take shape and form in the realm of the spirit.

It is then he realised that words had creative power, only that we did not see with our physical eyes the things our words were creating.

Understand from today that your words can be used to create.

Decide to create a world worth living in with your words.

The clouds, light and all manner of things were spoken into being.

Imagine such power in your words.

The Bible accounts for it generously here:

Gen 1:3 And God said, Let there be light: and there was light.

Gen 1:4 And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness.

Gen 1:5 And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

Gen 1:6 And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.

Gen 1:7 And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so.

Gen 1:8 And God called the firmament Heaven. And

the evening and the morning were the second day.

Gen 1:9 And God said, Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry land appear: and it was so.

Gen 1:10 And God called the dry land Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas: and God saw that it was good.

Gen 1:11 And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so.

Gen 1:12 And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that it was good.

Gen 1:13 And the evening and the morning were the third day.

Gen 1:14 And God said, Let there be lights in the

firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years:

Gen 1:15 And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so.

Gen 1:16 And God made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night: he made the stars also.

Gen 1:17 And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth,

Gen 1:18 And to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness: and God saw that it was good.

Gen 1:19 And the evening and the morning were the fourth day.

Gen 1:20 And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and

fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven.

Genesis 1:3-20

All these things were created with words.

The next significant use of words is to name.

Naming
