Intro:

The choices one makes while alive determines their eternal destiny.

No one is predetermined to spend eternity in hell. It's a matter of choice.

Life does not stop with the grave. There will be a final resurrection, one to eternal life, one to eternal death. **John 5**; **Daniel 12**.

I. The Scene

The universe will not be re configured, it will be destroyed.

Four observations here:

- 1. John sees a Great White Throne.

 Daniel 7:10
- 2. He sees One who is seated on it. The judge is the Lord. Jn. 5:22, Romans 2:16.
- 3. The heavens and earth are uncreated, 2 Peter 3:13, Hebrews 1:10-12.
- 4. John sees the dead, great and small.

II. The Summons

The souls of all the ungodly are kept in torment and misery in hades. It's different from hell:

- 1. It's temporary, Rev. 20:14,
- 2. Only their souls are there, perhaps in a temporary body.

It is the second resurrection called a resurrection unto damnation, or contempt. Daniel 12:2

III. The Standard

God has a record of every person's life according to their deeds. They will be measured against His perfect standards. Matt. 5:48, 1 Peter 1:15,16;

There will be three main areas of judgment:

- 1. Judged by their thoughts, Lk. 8:17
- 2. A judgment of words, Matt. 12:37,
- 3. Judged by their deeds, Matt. 16:27, Rev. 12:22.

Only a Christian can accomplish "Good Works".
