

Further Reflection - 1 Peter 2

- 1. Read verses 1-3 and rewrite them in your own words.
 - a. What jumps out at you from what you wrote down?
 - b. How do you make sure to "grow up in your salvation?"
- 2. What is Peter explaining by talking about a "spiritual house?"
- 3. Describe each of these phrases and why they matter so much:
 - a. Chosen people
 - b. Royal Priesthood
 - c. Holy Nation
 - d. God's Special Possession
- 4. Why is it important to recognize that Peter is writing to a people not to individuals? What are the implications of that for our lives today?
- 5. What does it look like to live out verse 12 in our day?
- 6. Peter tells followers of Jesus to submit to governing authorities (keep in mind it was likely the Emperor Nero when Peter wrote this). How do we recognize what are the appropriate times to NOT follow (hint: not about our personal preference)? Think in terms of the "law of love?"
- 7. Read Isaiah 53 and write out the connection to Peter's words in verses 22-25.
- 8. Jesus suffered for the sake of others, are we willing to suffer for the sake of others?
