Reflection:

- 1. What is your best experience with a neighbor?
- 2. What is your worst experience with a neighbor?
- 3. Biblically, a neighbor is anyone else, what neighbors are most difficult for you? Why?

Study:

- 1. Read Luke 10:25-37
 - a. What are the things that jump out to you from the text?
- b. The passage begins with Jesus giving a command on how the people of God are called to live. What about that command is difficult for you to put into practice?
- c. Why do you think the "expert in the Law" was pushing so hard to clarify a definition of "who is my neighbor?"
- d. The parable of The Good Samaritan contains three different people walking by the person who had been wounded. What is the difference from a religious perspective of each of them?4
- e. In what ways does it seem the good Samaritan went above and beyond what is "normal" in helping others?
- f. Jesus sends the expert in the Law on his way, with the words "go and do likewise" and he is talking about having mercy on others. In what ways is mercy easy/difficult for you?
- g. What is a modern day way, that you could be a "Good Samaritan"?

Application:

- 1. What are ways you can be a good neighbor?
- 2. How can we be better neighbors as a church?

Prayer:

Father, help me to be a good neighbor to all others. Especially, the people that are difficult for me to love. May I see in others the Divine Image in which they are created. In Jesus' name I Pray. Amen.

Spiritual Practice:

Seek opportunities to listen to others with whom you may disagree.
