APPLICATION QUESTIONS

James 1:22 says, *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”* These questions are designed to help you apply today’s message to your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others. For more information about joining a Small Group that uses these questions as the basis for discussion, prayer, and accountability, please call the church office at (661) 259-2913.

1. Read John 6:22-23. Have you ever looked for Jesus at a time in your life when you felt like you couldn’t find Him? What did you do? How does Jer. 29:13; John 1:1, 14; and Matt. 11:28-30 point you in the right direction?

2. Read John 6:24-26. Why do you think Jesus was so quick to accuse the crowd instead of to answer their question? How do Mk. 3:32 and Jn. 18:4 help us understand in what way the Jews were seeking Jesus?

3. Read John 6:27. What was Jesus teaching in this verse? How does 1 Pet. 1:3-4 and Matt. 6:19-21 help you understand this even more clearly? Do you struggle with seeking things from this earthly life more than you should?

4. Read John 6:28-29. What is the “work of God” discussed in this passage? How do we know that believing in God is not a work? Is repentance a work? (Phil. 1:29; 2 Tim. 2:25)

5. Read John 6:30-33. What was the comparison that was going on here? What is the difference between the manna and the true bread from heaven? (Jn. 6:38, 50-51, 58)

6. Read John 6:34-35. Were the Jews sincere in v. 34? How do you know? (Jn. 6:41-42) What did Jesus mean that if you come to Him you will never hunger and if you believe in Him you will never thirst? (Ps. 42:1-2; 63:1)

7. Read the take home questions. Which one challenges you or encourages you the most? Why? How will you live your life differently this week based on this passage of Scripture?
