1. Read John 6:45. What does Jesus mean when He says “all will be taught by God”? Which one of these OT cross-references listed here help you to better understand this? What’s at the real heart of the matter?

2. Read Jn. 14:26; 16:12-13; 1 Jn. 2:20, 26-27; 1 Cor. 2:9-13; Matt. 16:17; Rom. 10:17. How do these NT references help us understand “all will be taught by God” as well?

3. Read John 6:46. How does this verse point at the exclusivity of Christ? What does this mean? Why is this essential to the Christian faith?

4. Read John 6:47. What does it mean that believing in the gospel is true for all people (Jn. 3:15-19) and true for all of life (Jn. 3:36)? Why is this important to understand?

5. Read Galatians 3:5-9. How was Abraham saved? How could the gospel have been preached to Him back then?

6. Read John 6:48-51. Why must all eat of the living bread? What are some of the similarities and differences between the manna of the OT and the living bread of the NT?

7. Read the take home questions. Which one encourages you or challenges you the most? Why? What truth have you learned from this text that you can apply in your life this week?
