James 1:22 says, *“But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.”* These questions are designed to help you apply today’s message to your life. We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others. 1. Read John 10:31-33. Why did the Jews want to stone Jesus? What was Jesus’ response to this action? Why was this so brilliant? What can we learn from this?

2. What is the sin of blasphemy? How does Leviticus 24:16 justify the Jews’ actions in their eyes? Why is this so ironic? (Mk. 3:28-30)

3. Read John 10:34-36. What is Jesus’ argument here? (Ps. 82:6) What is Jesus’ view of inerrancy? (Matt. 5:17-18; 19:4-6)

4. Read John 10:37-38. What is Jesus’ point in these two verses? What are the evidences given of Jesus doing the works of the Father? (Jn. 5:17, 19, 36; Matt. 3:16-17; 17:5-6; Jn. 12:27-30) What result should these evidences have on a person’s life?

5. Read John 10:39-42. Why weren’t they able to arrest Jesus? Where did Jesus go? Why did He go there? What encouragement can we draw from this?

6. Read Jeremiah 23:29 and Matthew 21:44. How do these two verses correlate with each other? How do they shine insight on this sermon today?

7. Read the take home questions. Which one challenges you or encourages you the most? Why? How will you live your life differently this week based on this passage?
