God's Good News Story

Jesus - The Light of The World

You & I - Light Bearers of Christ's Love

In our year long series 'God's Good News Story' we have traced the work of God to bring mankind into a right relationship with Him. It has been a story of obedience and disobedience of light and darkness.

Adrian Rogers in his book "Standing for Light and Truth", tells this story... "I heard of an English professor who walked into his classroom one day and wrote these words on the blackboard 'Walk with light.' He then asked the students who wrote these words. Some said Goethe, others Emerson, and still others guessed the poet Wordsworth. But the professor said, 'No, I read these words on the traffic light on my way to class this morning." (p. 15)

"The first words of God recorded in the Bible are: Genesis 1:3..."Let there be light." King David sings (around 1000 B.C.): Psalm 27:1..."The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" Psalm 119:105... "Thy Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path".

Later we find in <u>1 John 1:5</u>... "*God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all*". Darkness universally symbolizes sin and death; light corresponds to life and holiness and purity.

Sadly, much of this story we have seen the darkness of mankind's disobedience and sin. Last week we briefly touched on the the 400 year period of silence and darkness between the Old testament and the New Testament. Isaiah the prophet, around 700 years before Christ lamented about the rise of darkness among God's people.

Isaiah 9:2... The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.

Fast forward 700 or so years and we find God's answer to the darkness...

John 1: 1-14... In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him not even one thing came into being that has come into being. ⁴In Him was life, and the life was the Light of mankind. ⁵ And the Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not grasp it. ⁶A man came, one sent from God, and his name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to testify about the Light, so that all might believe through him. 8He was not the Light, but he came to testify about the Light. ⁹ This was the true Light that, coming into the world, enlightens every person. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through Him, and yet the world did not know Him. 11 He came to His own, and His own people did not accept Him. 12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God,

to those who believe in His name, ¹³ who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of a man, but of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us; and we saw His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

This passage ties together last week's message on John the Baptist and the Ministry of Light of Jesus. Jesus is the one and only True source of Light, of Hope of Redemption.

John 8:12...Then Jesus spoke to them again: "I AM the Light of the World. Anyone who follows Me will never walk in the darkness but will have the light of life."

- Light communicates safety (Ps 56:13, 1 Jn 1:7).
- Light brings comfort (Ps 78:14, 139:12).
- Light invites enjoyment (Eccl 11:7).

- Light communicates things about God (James 1:17).
- Light is used to describe salvation (2 Cor 4:4-6, Eph 5:13-14, 1 Jn 1:7).
- Light is used as a garment (Rom 13:12, 2 Cor 11:14).

The People of God and Light

- Israel was called to be a light to the nations (Is 42:6, 49:6, 60:3).
- The church is the light of the world (Matt 5:14-16, Eph 5:8, Phil 2:15).
- We are children of light (Matt 16:8, Eph 5:8, 1 Thess 5:5).
- We are the saints in light (Col 1:12).
- We are called into His marvelous light (1 Pet 2:9).
- We should bear the fruit of light (Eph 5:9).
- We should wear the armor of light (Rom 13:12).

But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

As Christians and Disciples of Jesus Christ we have a responsibility and privilege to be bearers of God's Light. Jesus is the True Light, but He has called us to share the light to a world in need.

A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.
