Eulogia...(gk) Means To speak well of, implies a <u>benefit</u> to the recipient.

Tangible Realities:

Needed to be successful in our process of **Sanctification**.

In Christ:


To be "organically" united with Christ through our response of faith to God's gracious offer of eternal life in His Son, Jesus Christ. Our life is,"...hidden with the Messiah in God"

A Present, Spiritual Reality:

We don't ask for them, they have already been promised. (Joshua 1:1-3; Philippians 4:19)

I. He has chosen us:

A. Chosen = "Eklegomai" (gk)
To choose out from among a group/number for a purpose.

In the very beginning, when this great universe lay in the mind of God, like unborn forests in the acorn cup; long ere the echoes awoke the solitudes; before the mountains were brought forth; and long ere the light flashed through the sky, God loved His chosen creatures. - I. He has chosen us:
 - B. Before the foundation of the World It was His sovereign choice: Jn. 15:16
 - C. To be holy and blameless in His sight
 We were chosen for a purpose: 1 Peter 2:9
 - 1. Holy, hagios (gk) = consecrated/set apart.
 - 2. Blameless, amōmos (gk) without blemish, faultless. As a sacrificial lamb.

The goal of our sanctification/ what He sees as we are "in Christ".

By necessity the doctrine of Unconditional Election flows from the belief of human depravity. Because the will of man is utterly dead (Rom. 3:9-16) and cannot choose God, God must exercise His sovereign will to save. Out of the mass of fallen humanity God made an eternal distinguishing choice. Before the foundation of the world He determined who He would save. "Were it not for God's choice of His elect, none would be saved" C.H. Spurgeon

- II. He has predestined us unto adoption
 - A. Predestined, poorizō (gk) to predetermine, or decide beforehand.
 - 1. Events leading up to Christ's crucifixion Acts 4:25-28
 - 2. Our adoption is predestined Eph. 1:4
 - 3. Our conformity to Christ Rom. 8:29-30
 - 4. Our future inheritance in Christ Eph. 1:11
 - B. Adopted, huiothesia (gk) the placing as a son.
 - 1. Has a dual meaning, present and future.
 - a. Present, we are brought into God's family as sons
 - b. Future, Rom. 8:22-23

We don't get into God's family via adoption, but only by the New Birth. Jn. 3:1-18; 1 Peter 1:22-25

- II. He has predestined us unto adoptionC. Through Jesus Christ, for Himself, to the praise of His glorious grace
 - 1. The Cause of this: Through Jesus Christ
 - 2. The Manner: To Himself/According to His good pleasure and will
 - 3. The End: To the praise of His glorious grace
- III. He has graced, accepted, favored us in the beloved
 - A. Favored, charitoō (gk) to make accepted, be highly favored
 - 1. Our acceptance by God has nothing to do with us
 - 2. "in the Beloved" is being in Christ

"And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts crying, *Abba*, *Father*. So you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God" Gal. 4:6-7
