## **Further Reflection for 10/31**

#### **Reflection:**

- 1. What is a moment in which someone made you, or your needs an obvious priority in their life? How did it make you feel?
- 2. What is a moment when someone you cared about made it obvious that you were not a priority to them? How did that make you feel?
- 3. Why might it be especially important to "make space" for young people in the church?

#### Study:

- 1. Read Mark 9:36-37 and Mark 10:13-16
  - a. What are the similarities between the passages?
  - b. What are the differences in the passages?
  - c. Why do you think the disciples responded the way they did in the chapter 10 passage after what happened in chapter 9?
  - d. What are the implications in our lives and the life of the church if we take verse 37 of chapter 9 seriously?
  - e. In chapter 10 Jesus mentions that the Kingdom of God "belongs to such as these" what do you think he means by that?

### **Application:**

- 1. How are you making space for someone younger than you?
- 2. What is a way you can prioritize the next generation?
- 3. Write a note and thank a person who has prioritized you, especially in regards to your faith.

#### **Prayer:**

Father, help me to trust you for defining who I am and recognize my value is not lost when others are prioritized. Help me to think of others first so that I might "lose myself" knowing that in losing myself I will actually "find myself". In Jesus' name I Pray. Amen.

#### **Spiritual Practice:**

 Practice thinking about and acting on putting others first for the sake of Jesus. Think less on your preference and opinion and more on how love might be increased.
