Further Reflection for 10/23

Reflection:

- 1. When is a moment you were looking something from a poor perspective and when you changed vantage points what you saw was radically different?
- 2. What has been a moment in life that your perspective on some issue has changed. Why did it change?

Study:

- 1. Read Revelation 4 and 5
 - a. What jumps out to you from the text?
 - b. Are there any images/illustrations that John writes that reminded you of other biblical texts? If so, which ones?
 - c. Most biblical scholars see the 24 elders seated as the 12 tribes of Israel (representing the old covenant) and the 12 apostles (representing the new covenant), what might that imply by them being together?
 - d. "Holy, holy holy, is the Lord God Almighty; who was, and is, and is to come." What does this line tell us about God?
 - e. Reread 5:5 and notice how the elder says to look at the Lion of Judah, but when John looks, he sees the Lamb. What is significant about looking for lion and finding lamb? What does this tell us about the nature of what Jesus has done?
 - f. Summarize 5:9-10. Notice the word "purchased" is the same word Paul and others use to describe when a slave is purchased to be given freedom. How does that help you understand this passage?
 - g. One of the main points of these two chapters is a vision of the worship of God and then a call for the followers of Jesus being called to worship. Worship is the central act of the followers of Jesus. In what ways is it easy to live a life of worship? In what ways is it difficult?

Application:

1. What is one step you can make to be more intentional in living a life of worship?

Prayer:

Father, help me to recognize you have done through your Son, what I cannot do on my own. May I learn to trust you more and to more and more live a life of worship. In Jesus' name I Pray. Amen.

Spiritual Practice:

- Begin each day this week thinking on how you will worship this week.
- End each day this week reflecting on what your worship looked like this week.
