We encourage you to thoughtfully answer these questions and discuss your answers with others. 1. What temptations do you face that could allow commercialism to consume your Christmas? How do you enjoy the season without losing sight of Jesus?

2. Read Luke 2:1-4a. Now look at Micah 5:2; John 7:40-42; and Matt. 2:1, 5-6. Why is it so important to know that the Christ was to be born in Bethlehem?

3. Read Luke 2:4b-5. Now look at 2 Sam. 7:12-13. What is the 2 Samuel passage known as? Which covenant is it highlighting? What is the significance of this as we reflect on Luke 2?

4. Read Luke 2:6-7. How does the fact that there was no room in the inn in Bethlehem affect you as you examine our world today? Is there room for Jesus in our culture? Please discuss.

5. Read Luke 2:8-14. What is the significance of this passage? Discuss some of the things that the sermon outline points out. Which one of those sub-points did you think was the most interesting? Why?

6. Read Luke 2:15-21. Why do you think the angels chose to come and make this announcement to the shepherds? Why wasn't the announcement made in the town square of Bethlehem? Talk about what you learned by examining what we read about the shepherds that very night.

7. Look at the take home points. How can you make this Christmas a little more like the first Christmas?
