Ephesians 6:15-16



#### Intro:

We saw last week our spiritual battles were not a one time event but a daily occurrence.

We also noticed that our enemy, Satan and his evil minions we very well organized, intelligent and exceptionally strong. We have no hope of defeating them in the strength of our flesh, so we are admonished to stand firm in the strength of the Lord.

Every Christian is to be engaged in this spiritual battle. As we have become a part of God's kingdom we are now the enemy of Satan and his attacks against us are assured.

Intro: No Christian can be demon possessed; our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit. Satan doesn't work from within us but outside us pandering to our fallenness inside, the fleshly desires of that part of us not yet regenerated. Romans 7:14-20

As we go into battle we need to remember:

- 1. Satan is a vanquished foe; Hebrews 2:14, 1 Jn. 3:8
- 2. Although vanquished he is still lethal and hostile to those who are unaware of his schemes. 2 Cor. 2:11, 1 Pet. 5:8

We need to be alert, sober minded, and thinking biblically at all times.

#### I. Boots for the Battle

To prepare for battle we must have appropriate shoes on our feet. We are told to have our feet shod with the readiness that comes from the Gospel of Peace.

The Greeks and Romans had proper footwear to protect them from the enemy's tactics and so they could stand their ground and fight. They wore them whether or not they were in a battle. They were always prepared to fight.

As this command of Paul's is in the Greek middle voice, it is up to us to see to it that we appropriate God's gracious provision of our Boots for Battle.

#### I. Boots for the Battle

The term, "Gospel of Peace does not refer to any kind of evangelism. We're at war; we need to stand firm and fight. 1 Cor. 16:13.

The Readiness that comes from the Gospel of peace is the peace we have knowing we are at peace with God and that He is on our side. Romans 5:1

# "The Armor of God" Peace and Faith II. Shield of Faith

If we are always complaining about our situation it means we are defeated in battle. Instead, we are to rejoice always, Phil. 4:4, and give thanks in all circumstances, 1 Thess. 5:18.

We need to remember a few things about the attacks of Satan:

- 1. We need not be surprised at Satan's attacks, that's his nature; he will attack us so don't complain.
- 2. God allows those attacks so we can mature in our faith, James 1:2-4.

Spurgeon comments: Like Spartans, every Christian is born a warrior. It is his destiny to be assaulted; it is his duty to attack.

# "The Armor of God" Peace and Faith II. Shield of Faith

This Shield of Faith extinguishes the flaming arrows, to prevent their fire of deception, lies and discouragement from spreading.

Faith here is not what you believe, it is how you believe and in whom you believe.

Faith is acting upon our belief in who Christ is, our belt of truth, our breastplate of righteousness, our Gospel of peace, and our shield of faith.
