1. Read Acts 2:22. Who is Peter preaching to? What was their question? Why does Peter emphasize that Jesus was from Nazareth? What was the purpose of the mighty works, wonders, and signs? (Jn. 1:46; Matt. 3:17; Mk. 9:7; Jn. 12:27-28; Matt. 11:4-5)

2. Read Acts 2:23. Why was Jesus rejected? How does the definite plan and foreknowledge of God work? (Acts 4:27-28; 2 Tim. 1:9; Rev. 13:8; Matt. 26:24; Rom. 8:29; 11:2; 2 Pet. 1:2, 20)

3. Read Acts 2:24. What is this verse talking about? How is that encouraging to you right now, this day, in this minute? (Heb. 2:14; Lk. 24:46; Jn. 2:18-22; 1 Cor. 15:16-26)

4. Read Acts 2:25-28. Where is this passage taken from? What was the main thing you learned from it? How does that help you in your life today? (Psa. 16:8-11)

5. Read Acts 2:29-31. What do we learn from these verses? How did David foresee and speak about the resurrection of Christ? (Acts 2:30; Psa. 2:1-9; 89:3)

6. Read Acts 2:32-36. What does David mean by verses 34-35 taken from Psalm 110:1? How does this encourage you today? What does it mean for Jesus to be both Lord and Christ?

7. Read the take home questions. Which one encourages you or challenges you the most? How will you live differently this week based on what you have learned from this passage?
