Part 1

Ephesians 6:10-11

Intro:

We live in a world that is hostile. We live as Christians, not on a playground but a battleground. While our Christian journey is described as a walk, it's not a walk in the park!

You can't go through the New Testament without running into several scriptures that depict our New life in Christ as a battle.

2 Cor. 10:3-4; Rom. 13:12; 1 Peter 2:11; 2 Tim. 4:7; 1 Tim. 1:18.

It's important to realize that when we became a Christian we were drafted into God's army.

Intro:

There was no choice involved. When we became a friend of God we inherited His enemy.

Satan is a thief who is described as one who comes only to rob, kill and destroy. His whole desire is to cause as much damage, the most misery and to negate the believer's witness to Christ.

If we are not engaged in this battle we will fall victim to his schemes.

I. Stand Strong in the Lord

Paul uses several words for strength in this verse. In Eph. 1:19-20 he uses Power, Strength, and Might. And in 3:16, "...Strengthened with Power".

While we are not strong in ourselves, we must take the initiative to be strong in the Lord. To do so we must:

A. First of all, be in the Lord
Being in the Lord is a function/result of our
salvation. We have to be in the Lord to understand
being strengthened in the Lord.

I. Stand Strong in the Lord

- B. We must know our weaknesses.
 This is a process begun at salvation, knowing we can't save our selves. As we mature we become more aware of our need of God's grace and mercy.
- C. We must know the Lord's Strength. Gen. 18, 21; Jer. 32:7; Zech. 8:6; Matt. 19:26; Lk. 1:37; Rom. 4:21

II. Standing Firm Against the Enemy

A. We must put on the full armor of God.

"Stand" is a military term and means holding one's position regardless of the opposition. We rely on God's strength and are provided with His armor, but must take the initiative to put it on.

He is:

- 1. The belt of truth, Jn. 14:6
- 2. Our breastplate of righteousness, 2 Cor. 5:21
- 3. The gospel of peace that we stand on, Eph. 2:13-14
- 4. The shield of our faith, Heb. 12:2

II. Standing Firm Against the Enemy

- 5. Our helmet of salvation, Titus 3:6
- 6. Our Sword of the Lord, Jn. 1:1
- B. We must grow in Biblical understanding
 - 1. We need to understand God's provision as revealed in His word;

The first three chapters tell us what God has given us for battle. If you don't know what it is, it's the same as not having it.

II. Standing Firm Against the Enemy

2. We need to understand the Schemes of the devil;

The Greek word for Scheme is, "methodeia". It has the meaning of being deceitful or deceptive. If we remain ignorant of his schemes the Bible tells us he will take advantage of us. 2 Cor. 2:11

3. We need to know where to stand firm and where to be tolerant.

II. Standing Firm Against the Enemy

Negotiables and non negotiables. Standing firm against the devil means standing firm on the core values of the faith, not being tricked into taking exception to side issues that have nothing to do with our fellowship in Christ.

C. We must stand firm with Biblical Practice.

Put into practice what you believe. Psalm 34:8 says; "Taste and see that the Lord is good...". Experience God.

II. Standing Firm Against the Enemy

Standing firm is not a "Let go and Let God" proposition. We must recognize our weakness in spiritual warfare, trust our Lord to provide the spiritual strength we need to be victorious, and then hold our ground. 2 Chron. 20:12-17.
