Further Reflection for 5/23

- 1. Read Acts 2:1-21
- 2. Share a time when you were in a place/situation in which you spoke a language that few others spoke. How did it make you feel? What went through your mind as you listened to others?
- 3. When you read the passage, what things popped in your head? Put yourself in the shoes of the believers gathered together or the onlookers, what would be going through your mind?
- 4. The writer of Acts talks uses imagery (things like fire, a sound like a wind that came from heaven) in the depiction of this event. Why might those things have significance?
- 5. In this passage we see people are gathered together from all around the world, likely all in the temple courts. What is significant about that?
- 6. Verse 13 shares that some who saw what was going on mocked it and assumed that people had too much to drink. When have you experienced something that you know to be true and maybe someone else belittled you or your experience?
- 7. Peter quotes from Joel 2:28-32, what are things that jump out to you from those texts in Peter's message (verses 17-21)?
- 8. Peter ends his quotation from Joel with the line "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." How might that line be hope-filled for you today?
- 9. Why do you think it is significant that this event happened among a whole group of people and not just individuals at their homes?
- 10. Pray this week, "Father, help me to be hear your voice and listen for the leading of your Spirit. May I share with boldness when you are urging me to share a message of hope. Help me to always call on the name of the Lord. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen."
