Summary of Legislation

Fiscal Note

Status:

Under current law, employers hiring an employee to provide care to an at-risk adult must conduct a Colorado Adult Protective Services data system (CAPS) check to identify any substantiated claims of mistreatment against an at-risk adult. CAPS is run by the Department of Human Services (DHS). Beginning January 1, 2024, the bill requires staffing agencies to conduct a CAPS check for any employee provided who will have contact with at-risk adults. The staffing agency is required to provide results of the CAPS check and any subsequent notifications of substantiated findings to the employer.

State Revenue and Expenditures

For FY 2023-24 only, workload will increase for the CAPS Check Unit in DHS to update processes related to records checks from staffing agencies. On an ongoing basis, the bill may also lead to more CAPS check requests from staffing agencies, which would minimally increase cash fund revenue from fees to the DHS and workload to process these checks. However, this increase may be offset by a reduction in duplicate CAPS checks, which in some cases are currently conducted on the same employee by both the employer and a staffing agency.

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Effective Date

The bill takes effect January 1, 2024.
