## **Bill Summary**

Joint Budget Committee. Under current law, community health workers may be reimbursed through the Colorado medical assistance program as long as the community health worker appears on the voluntary competency-based community health worker registry verifying that the community health worker completed state-approved training and

credentialing requirements.

The bill eliminates reimbursement for community health workers under the Colorado medical assistance program.

7	meets credentialing requirements based on competency statements that
8	represent generalist entry-level core competencies for unlicensed
9	community health workers and must MAY be listed on the department's
10	voluntary competency-based community health worker registry. in order
11	to be reimbursed through the state medical assistance program for
12	providing community health worker covered services to a medicaid
13	member.
14	(3) Participation in the voluntary competency-based community
15	health worker registry is not required for community health workers who
16	do not seek reimbursement through medicaid.
17	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, repeal 25.5-5-334.
