101	CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS UNDER
102	THE "COLORADO ROAD AND COMMUNITY SAFETY ACT" TO
103	PERSONS WHO ARE NOT LAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED
104	STATES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN
105	APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Currently, a person who is not lawfully present in the United States may obtain a driver's license or identification card if certain requirements

are met. One of the requirements is that the person present a taxpayer identification card.

The bill allows a person to present a social security number as an alternative to a taxpayer identification card. The bill allows the license or identification card to be reissued or renewed in accordance with the process used for other licenses and identification cards.

A person whose license is lost or stolen may obtain a replacement without renewing the license.

Any registrant who loses an identification card and who, after obtaining a new identification card, finds the original card shall immediately surrender the original card to the department. The same documentary evidence shall be furnished for a new identification card as for an original identification card. A new identification card issued pursuant to this section shall expire on the birthday of the registrant in the fifth year after the issuance of the new identification card; except that, if the registrant is under the age of twenty-one years at the time the application for the new identification card is made, the new identification card shall expire on the registrant's twenty-first birthday, OR IF ISSUED UNDER PART 5 OF THIS ARTICLE 2, THE IDENTIFICATION CARD EXPIRES AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 42-2-509 (1) OR ON THE TWENTY-FIRST BIRTHDAY OF THE APPLICANT AS SET BY RULE OF THE DEPARTMENT.
