A BILL FOR AN ACT 101 CONCERNING CONTINUATION OF THE REGULATION OF CIVIL RIGHTS 102 ISSUES, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, IMPLEMENTING THE 103 RECOMMENDATION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY 104 AGENCIES' 2017 SUNSET REVIEW AND REPORT ON THE 105 COLORADO CIVIL RIGHTS DIVISION AND THE COLORADO CIVIL 106 RIGHTS COMMISSION TO CONTINUE THE DIVISION AND 107 COMMISSION AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Sunset Process - House Judiciary Committee. The bill implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory agencies in its sunset review of the Colorado civil rights division and the Colorado civil rights commission to continue the commission and the division and their respective functions for 9 years, through September 1, 2027.

2	for use by the civil rights division. This appropriation consists of
3	\$1,082,522 from the general fund and \$560,321 reappropriated funds
4	from indirect cost recoveries, and is based on an assumption that the
5	division will require an additional 27.2 FTE. To implement this act, the
6	division may use this appropriation as follows:
7	(a) \$1,558,385, which consists of \$998,064 general fund and
8	\$560,321 reappropriated funds from indirect cost recoveries, for personal
9	services;

21	(b) \$43,176 for operating expenses;
22	(c) \$1,000 for hearings pursuant to complaint;
23	(d) \$7,200 for commission meeting costs; and
24	(e) \$14,201 for indirect cost assessment.
25	SECTION 4. Effective date. This act takes effect July 1, 2018.
26	SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
