	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING THE CODIFICATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS PERTAINING
102	TO LIMITED GAMING, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
103	ALLOWING LICENSE APPLICANTS TO SUBMIT FINGERPRINTS
104	AFTER THE INITIAL SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION,
105	ELIMINATING THE STATUTORY LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF
106	PLAYERS PERMITTED IN THE GAME OF BLACKJACK, AND
107	ALLOWING A CASINO OPERATOR TO DIVIDE ITS LAWFUL GAMING
108	SPACE INTO MORE THAN TWO NONCONTIGUOUS SPACES.

Bill Summary

By executive order, to allow for social distancing to prevent the spread of COVID-19, Governor Polis:

- Suspended the operation of statutes prohibiting more than 7 players in the game of blackjack;
- Suspended the operation of statutes limiting a casino operator to 2 noncontiguous gaming areas within the casino; and
- Eliminated the requirement that an applicant for a limited gaming or sports betting license submit fingerprints simultaneously with the license application for purposes of conducting a fingerprint-based criminal history record check, instead allowing the applicant to submit fingerprints as a supplement to the application.

The bill codifies all 3 of these changes.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-30-103, amend 3 (6) as follows: 44-30-103. Definitions. As used in this article 30, unless the 4 5 context otherwise requires: 6 (6) "Blackjack" means a banking card game commonly known as 7 "21" or "blackjack" played by a maximum of seven players in which each 8 player bets against the dealer. The object is to draw cards whose value 9 will equal or approach twenty-one without exceeding that amount and 10 win amounts bet, payable by the dealer, if the player holds cards more 11 valuable than the dealer's cards. 12 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-30-508, amend 13 (3) as follows: 14 44-30-508. Licensed premises - retail floor plan - definition. 15 (3) A licensed retailer may change the physical location of the licensed 16 premises with the approval of the commission, the director, or the

1	director's designee. however, in no event shall the licensed premises as
2	modified violate any provision of this article 30 or consist of more than
3	two noncontiguous areas on one floor. Failure of the commission, the
4	director, or the director's designee to deny an application to relocate the
5	licensed premises in a building, within thirty days of the application, shall
6	be deemed an approval thereof.
7	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-30-510, amend
8	(3)(a) as follows:
9	44-30-510. Applicants and licensees - providing information
10	- criminal history record check. (3) (a) With the submission of OR AS
11	A SUPPLEMENT TO an application for a license or an application for a
12	finding of suitability pursuant to this article 30, each applicant shall
13	submit a set of fingerprints to the commission. The commission shall
14	forward the fingerprints to the Colorado bureau of investigation for the
15	purpose of conducting a state and national fingerprint-based criminal
16	history record check utilizing records of the Colorado bureau of
17	investigation and the federal bureau of investigation.
18	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-30-1504, amend
19	(7)(a) as follows:
20	44-30-1504. Disclosure of information by corporate applicants
21	- license required - investigation - criminal history record check -
22	rules - definition. (7) (a) Each applicant for a sports betting license, with
23	the submission of OR AS A SUPPLEMENT TO the application, shall submit
24	a set of fingerprints to the division. The division shall forward the
25	fingerprints to the Colorado bureau of investigation for the purpose of
26	conducting a state and national fingerprint-based criminal history record
27	check utilizing records of the Colorado bureau of investigation and the

- federal bureau of investigation. Only the actual costs of the record check shall be borne by the applicant. Nothing in this subsection (7) precludes the division from making further inquiries into the background of the applicant.
- SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
