## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause. However, if the General Assembly wants to authorize the Public Utilities Commission to spend money made available by the bill in FY 2016-17, it should include an appropriation clause.

## **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$150,000 cash funds from the Public Utilities Commission Fixed Utilities Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2016-17 for use by the Public Utilities Commission.

#### **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2016-17 based on the March 2016 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$3.2 million

General Fund for 2016 legislation that is not accounted for in the budget package, including \$3.0 million to be available for appropriations plus \$0.2 million for the associated 6.5 percent statutory reserve. If this amount is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.

#### Technical Issue

There is currently another bill, Senate Bill 16-087 (Highway-rail Crossing Signalization Fund Funding), that also diverts to a cash fund a portion of the 3.0 percent of fee revenue that is credited to the General Fund. If both H.B. 16-1186 and S.B. 16-087 are enacted into law, up to \$390,000 will be annually diverted from the General Fund. The projected credit to the General Fund in FY 2016-17 is approximately \$402,000. The average credit to the General Fund since FY 2011-12 is approximately \$346,000.
