	WHEREAS, More than 112,200 Colorado youth, with the

3 4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, The Colorado State University Extension 4-H Youth Development program works to serve military-connected youth through 4-H clubs and projects and special events and programs partnering with the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and National Guard and Reserves; and
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, Colorado State University Extension's partners consider 4-H an expert in research-based curricula; quality youth development programming; professional development training for adults; and science, technology, engineering, and mathematics education; and
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, Colorado 4-H returns \$45 million annually to the Colorado economy plus \$31 million in added value of volunteer-time contributions resulting in a tenfold return on investment over the cost to conduct the program; and
16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, A decade-long longitudinal study of positive youth development showed that, compared to their peers, youth involved in 4-H programs are: ! Four times more likely to make contributions to their communities; ! Two times more likely to be civically active; ! Two times more likely to make healthier choices; and ! Two times more likely to participate in science, engineering, or computer technology programs during out-of-school time; and
26 27 28	WHEREAS, Participation in 4-H in Colorado is open to youth between the ages of 5 and 19 from all economic, social, and cultural backgrounds; now, therefore,
29 30	Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-first General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:
31 32 33 34	 (1) That we, the members of the Colorado General Assembly: (a) Salute the Colorado 4-H program in its efforts to prepare Colorado's youth for the future, providing a wealth of opportunities for young people to acquire decision-making leadership and communication
