HB21-1099 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on Appropriations with favorable recommendation:
Amend printed bill page 2, after line 3 insert:
"(a) It is vital to keep children safe and families healthy and enhance the state's response to domestic abuse. Because the child welfare system has proven to disproportionally impact low-income families and members of Black, Indigenous, and persons of color communities, policies, rules, or procedures that address the impact of domestic abuse on families must be drafted with the goal of ensuring that these communities are not disproportionately or unfairly impacted. (b) Colorado can improve its diversity training and promote the understanding of the culture and background of the families that the child welfare system serves;".
Reletter succeeding subparagraphs accordingly.
Page 3, line 1, after "connect" insert "a specific incident of".
Page 3, strike lines 19 through 27.
Page 4, strike line 1.
Renumber succeeding C.R.S. sections accordingly.

Page 4, line 4, strike "Best" and substitute "Domestic abuse task force
