It increases state workload in FY 2022-23 only. **Appropriation** No appropriation is required. **Summary: Fiscal Note** The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill, which was recommended by the Legislative Status: Audit Committee.

Summary of Legislation

Current law requires the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) in the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) to track all controlled substances prescribed in Colorado and requires prescribers to query the PDMP prior to prescribing a second fill of any opioid or benzodiazepine prescription. The bill makes modifications to the PDMP, including:

- requiring each prescriber holding a Colorado license and a current federal Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registration to register and maintain a PDMP user account;
- requiring a prescriber to query the PDMP prior to prescribing any opioid or benzodiazepine;
- clarifying that each pharmacist holding a Colorado license is required to maintain a user account with the PDMP; and
- requiring that the Prescription Drug Monitoring Task Force conduct a stakeholder process, and subsequently evaluate and make recommendations to the Executive Director of DORA, regarding balancing enforcement of the PDMP with its use as a healthcare tool.
