### **Bill Summary**

The bill authorizes the department of corrections (department) to distribute compounded and prepackaged medications to pharmacies under the same ownership as the department.

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-118, amend
2	(15) (b) as follows:
3	12-42.5-118. Compounding - dispensing - sale of drugs and
4	devices - rules. (15) (b) The following may distribute compounded and
5	prepackaged medications, without limitation, to pharmacies under
6	common ownership of the entity:
7	(I) A prescription drug outlet owned and operated by a hospital
8	that is accredited by the joint commission on accreditation of healthcare
9	organizations or a successor organization; and
10	(II) A prescription drug outlet operated by a health maintenance
11	organization, as defined in section 10-16-102, C.R.S.; AND
12	(III) THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.
13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
