Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$29,705 General Fund to the Department of Human Services for FY 2016-17. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will receive \$8,823 federal funds to implement the act. The amendment further adds a provision appropriating \$21,928 reappropriated funds to the Governor's Office of Information Technology.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2016-17 based on the March 2016 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates \$3.0 million General Fund to be available to fund 2016 legislation that is not accounted for in the budget package. If the full \$3.0 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
