- (3) THE INTERNAL REVIEW REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION MUST INCLUDE:
- (a) A REVIEW OF THE COMMISSION'S AIR QUALITY CONTROL RULE-MAKING PROCESS IN ORDER TO ASSESS HOW IT IS CURRENTLY WORKING AND MAY BE IMPROVED;
- (b) A REPORT ON THE ECONOMIC FACTORS THAT THE COMMISSION CONSIDERS AND USES IN AN ECONOMIC IMPACT ANALYSIS OR A COST-BENEFIT ANALYSIS AND HOW THE INFORMATION REGARDING WORKFORCE IMPACTS IS TYPICALLY CONSIDERED WHEN CONDUCTING THE ANALYSIS;
- (c) AN EXPLANATION OF HOW ANALYSES THAT INCLUDE INFORMATION ON WORKFORCE IMPACTS ARE USED BY THE COMMISSION DURING THE ADOPTION OF AIR QUALITY CONTROL RULES;
- (d) A REPORT ON THE EXTENT TO WHICH WORKFORCE IMPACTS ARE CONSIDERED DURING THE CURRENT AIR QUALITY CONTROL RULE-MAKING PROCESS AND HOW CONSIDERATION OF WORKFORCE IMPACTS ARE INCORPORATED INTO EXISTING ECONOMIC ANALYSIS OR COST-BENEFIT ANALYSIS PROCEDURES;
- (e) AN EXPLANATION OF THE PARAMETERS AND LIMITATIONS THAT EXIST IN CURRENT STATE AND FEDERAL LAW;
- (f) Considerations or recommendations from the department as to whether having a standing workforce advisory council in the department would improve and support the economic impact analysis and related procedures and whether the department has any recommendations as to how such a workforce advisory council would be configured and what would be included in its overall mission;
- (g) SPECIFIC EXAMPLES OF COMPLETED ECONOMIC IMPACT ANALYSES WHERE WORKFORCE IMPACTS WERE CONSIDERED OR NOT CONSIDERED IN THE AIR QUALITY CONTROL RULE-MAKING PROCESS AND THE REASONS EACH ECONOMIC IMPACT ANALYSIS DID OR DID NOT INCLUDE CONSIDERATION OF WORKFORCE IMPACTS; AND
- (h) Legal and procedural considerations and recommendations concerning how more qualitative and quantitative data related to workforce impacts could be added to the economic impact analysis and cost-benefit analysis procedures in a manner that would not conflict with state or federal law or undermine the process of regulating air pollution or reducing greenhouse gas emissions in this state.
- (4) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL PREPARE A DRAFT REPORT OF THE REVIEW CONTAINING THE ELEMENTS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION AND, UPON COMPLETION OF THE DRAFT REPORT, ENGAGE

STAKEHOLDERS TO REVIEW THE REPORT AND PROVIDE INPUT FOR THE FINAL REPORT THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL SUBMIT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SOLICIT INPUT FROM REGULATED BUSINESSES, BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATIONS, ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS, LABOR ORGANIZATIONS, ORGANIZATIONS THAT REPRESENT DISPROPORTIONATELY IMPACTED COMMUNITIES, OTHER EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS, AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS THAT EXPRESS INTEREST IN PROVIDING INPUT. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MAY INCLUDE IN THEIR SOLICITATION OF INPUT SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS FROM STAKEHOLDERS CONCERNING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES TO EXPAND THE ECONOMIC IMPACT ANALYSES AND THE COST-BENEFIT ANALYSES.

- (5) On or before January 1, 2026, the executive director shall submit the final report described in subsection (4) of this section to the house of representatives energy and environment committee or its successor committee specifying how the department intends to improve the economic impact analyses and the cost-benefit analyses for the air quality control rule-making procedures and including any additional resources necessary to effect change, staffing challenges that need to be addressed, and other recommendations that may require a clarification or change in state law.
 - (6) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2026.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions."
