Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the Department of Revenue (DOR) to study the feasibility of regulating kratom processors, which are people who sell, prepare, or maintain products made from the plant *mitragyna speciosa*. The department must submit recommendations to the General Assembly by January 4, 2023.

State Expenditures

The bill increases workload in DOR to convene stakeholders, conduct research, and prepare the legislative report in FY 2022-23 only. This can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
